More people than ever are needing emergency food support, while donations are becoming stretched. By coming together in a spirit of generosity, we can help change that.

We hope this quiz brings fun, connection, and inspiration and encourages everyone to take a small step, whether by donating food, giving financially, or simply spreading the word.

There is one question (Round 2 Q.6) where all options are correct so you can choose how to award maximum points.
